Allow spaces for silence in between the spoken prayers.

May the Lord give us his peace. Amen.

Week 1: Mark 1:12-15
The Word in the Wilderness



As we begin to read, we ask the Lord to bring this text to life for us:

God our Father, source of all light, You have sent your Son into the world, to reveal yourself to all your children. Send Your Spirit upon us now, that we may meet Jesus in the Word that comes from you. May we come to know him, may we come to love him more deeply and so be drawn closer to the happiness of your Kingdom. Amen.

Mark 1:12-15

The Spirit immediately cast Jesus out into the desert. And he was in the desert forty days, tested by Satan; and he was with the wild beasts; and the angels served him.

After John was arrested, Jesus came into Galilee, proclaiming the gospel of God, and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has drawn near; repent and believe in the gospel."

4. Gospel means good news. Who proclaims the "good news of God" in our world? What are they saying?
