3. What word about your life—be it a word of thanksgiving, sorrow, joy, peace, petition—do you now bring to the Lord?

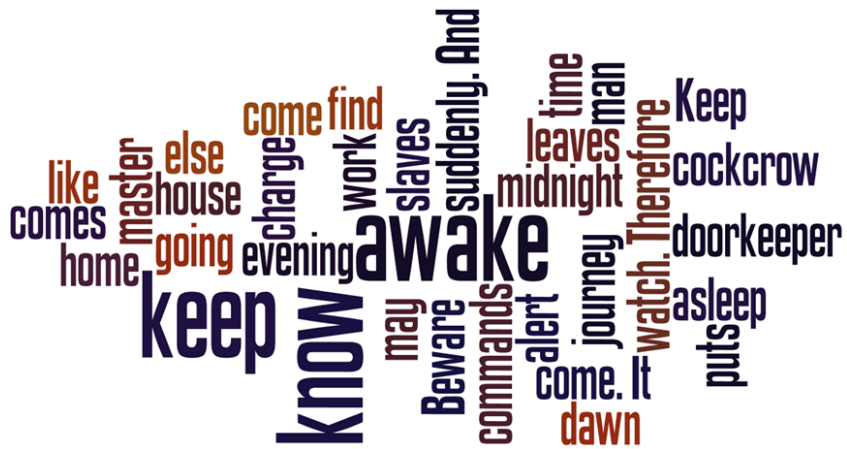
Closing Prayer: We gather our prayer together as we say:

Scripture this Advent**

Week 1 ~ Mark 13:33-37



The Word of God comes to us to awaken our hearts. We begin by praying: God our Father, source of all light, you have sent your Son into the world, to reveal yourself to all your children. Send your Spirit upon us now, that we may meet Jesus in the Word that comes from you. May we come to know him, may we come to love him more deeply and so be drawn closer to the happiness of your Kingdom. Amen.

Mark 13:33-37

Look out! Wake up! For you do not know when the time will be! It is like a man going abroad, when he leaves his house and puts his servants in charge, each with his work, and commands the doorkeeper to stay awake.

Stay awake therefore—for you do not know when the lord of the house will come, in the evening, or at midnight, or at cockcrow, or in the morning—in case he comes suddenly and finds *you* asleep. And what I say to you I say to all: Stay awake!”
