## Kilrush Session 4 13 3 2024 - Feedback Points

- We are privileged to have our Christian faith passed on to us by our parents/ grandparents unlike Nicodemus who had only the Old Testament
- Jesus when he referred to "water and the spirt" was not necessarily talking about baptism but more about being open to the Spirit
- Nicodemus is in all of us and could be one of us. We can identify with him, and Jesus expected him to be up to the challenge
- Nicodemus asks questions, wants to learn and get a clearer view of his faith
- There is struggle in all our lives and we have to trust in God and often simple childhood prayers can give us strength
- We may call ourselves Christian but may not be prepared to live a life fully committed to the values of Jesus
- "Born from above" does this mean that your life is preordained for you?
- Who is the "we" Jesus speaks of in the last paragraph. Could it be the Sprit and Himself
- Everybody has struggles in their lives but your experience of struggle might help somebody else
