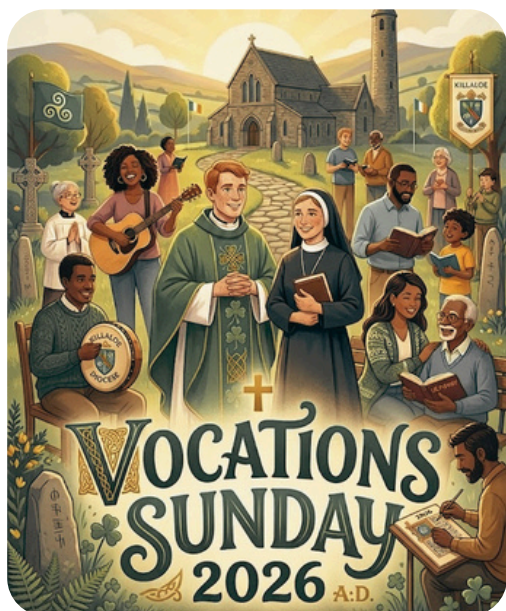
give us the greatest measure of happiness that we can expect in life. In the words of Saint Catherine of Siena; "If you are what you should be; you will set the world on fire."

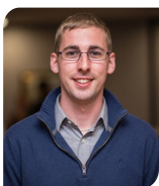

He did his Postulancy in Ennis, his Novitiate in Killarney and after making his first profession in Ennis, he continued his studies in Rome and completed CPE in Cork. Last September Ian made his final profession as a Franciscan in Ennis and in November last in the Poor Clare Monastery, Nuns Island, he was ordained a Deacon. He has ministered as a Deacon in the Cathedral in Galway since his ordination. On Sunday 31st May in the Friary in Ennis he will be ordained to the priesthood by Bishop Fintan.

Pope Leo XIV – Message for Vocations Sunday

Pope Leo XIV has released his message for the 63rd World Day of Prayer for Vocations, which falls this year on April 26, the fourth Sunday of Easter, also called "Good Shepherd Sunday." The Pope called the day "an occasion of grace in which we share some reflections on the interior dimension of vocation, understood as the discovery of God's free gift that blossoms in the depths of our hearts."

He also called it an opportunity to "explore together the truly beautiful path of life along which the Shepherd guides us." The Pope invited everyone, "families, parishes, and religious communities, as well as bishops, priests, deacons, catechists, educators, and all the faithful," to commit themselves more fully to creating conditions that allow this gift to be embraced, nourished, protected, and accompanied so that it may bear abundant fruit. 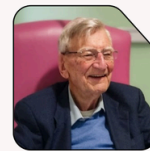
